Dear WPC Members and Friends:

The Pastor and Fellowship Chair and Co-Chair expressed an interest last year about encouraging others to learn how we select menus, order supplies, and set protocols for staging the hospitality hour after worship. The January 18 meeting included Ken McDyer because of his background as a chef and restaurateur. After exchanging many good ideas, the result focused on a "team concept" with set menus for each Sunday unless a special occasion calls for a change or donor/member choice.

We will start in February. A signup board has been posted in Fellowship Hall for your convenience. Please plan to serve 40 attendees with a budget not to exceed \$140. Receipts are required for reimbursement to the Fellowship budget. Donations are always welcome.

1<sup>st</sup> Sunday of the Month: Soup Sunday - Hosted by Fellowship.

2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of the Month: Salads or (committee choice).

3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of the Month: Potluck – Hosted by the congregation. A sign-up board will be posted in Fellowship Hall. Fellowship will provide coffee, tea, and waters.

4<sup>th</sup> Sunday of the month: Hosted by Fellowship.

5<sup>th</sup> Sunday of the month (March/June/Sept./Dec.: Pizzas or Surprise Sunday.

Fellowship Responsibilities: Set up — usually on Friday or Saturday. Bring your food items in if possible, ahead of schedule. On Sunday, make coffee, set out non-perishable food and plug in coffee about 9:30a.m. before attending worship. Please remember that we have members/friends with food allergies. We suggest that you make a note if food contains dairy, raw onions, or tomatoes and have one or two gluten free options available.

Food service can be done after worship, followed by clean up and trash detail.

We welcome support in all forms -sign up for set up/serving/clean up and trash detail.

The outline above will allow Fellowship Committee members to participate in the worship service more often as well as train others about how the committee functions.
