

Psalm & Reflection of the Day

Holy Reading: Psalm 8:1a, 3-9

O Lord, our Sovereign, how majestic is your name in all the earth! When I look at your heavens, the work of your fingers, the moon and the stars that you have established; what are human beings that you are mindful of them, mortals that you care for them?

Yet you have made them a little lower than God and crowned them with glory and honor. You have given them dominion over the works of your hands; you have put all things under their feet, all sheep and oxen and also the beasts of the field, the birds of the air, and the fish of the sea, whatever passes along the paths of the seas.

O Lord, our Sovereign, how majestic is your name in all the earth!

Silent Reflection: Where in nature do you most experience the Divine Presence? How does taking care of the environment glorify God?

*Praying with Body, Heart, and Soul:

O Lord, source of my being

Inhale: Feel the energy from your feet to your lifted heart.

Your majesty fills the earth.

Exhale: Marvel at the magnificence of God's creation.

I see the sun, the moon, the starts,

Inhale: Look up, and soak in God's eternal light.

And I wonder: Who am I?

Exhale: Humble yourself in the presence of the Almighty One.

You entrusted to me your creation.

Inhale: Unconditionally welcome all God's creatures.

Planet earth and everything within it.

Exhale: Bending forward, reverently acknowledge all God's creatures as family.

Wonderful creatures on land.

Inhale: Feel the presence of all people and animals and creatures living on land.

Magnificent birds of the air.

Exhale: "Spread your wings." Lighten up your heart, let it soar, delight, and fly.

And all the fish of the sea.

Inhale: Breathe in and swim with all the colorful fish of the sea.

How majestic is your creation.

Exhale: Celebrate God's gift of life.

Sitting with the Divine Presence: Sitting comfortably, with your back straight, eyes gently closed, notice your breath. Feel it moving in and out of the nostrils. As you breathe in and out, imagine yourself as an unfinished marble statue, a work in progress. Be aware of the Divine Sculptor carving out anything that keeps you from being the masterpiece God designed you to be. Feel the Creator's loving hands, sometimes gentle, though at times they feel rough, shaping you into the image and likeness of the One who created you. Stay with the Divine Sculptor for a while longer.

Living Your Prayer: Take a contemplative walk on the beach or in a nearby wooded park or a wilderness sanctuary. Like a little child, be awed, be amazed, and be fascinated by God's majestic creation.

Contemporary Psalm: O Holy One, source of all goodness, truth, and beauty, I long to look into your face and lose myself in your gaze.

You blessed me with life and free will, and placed within my reach every thing I need.

Help me to uphold the spirit of your creation, that all may celebrate the beauty and love you offer.

Blessed are you, O Creator of all existence, masterful are the works of your hands.

Sit in silence, be still. Listen to the rhythmic beat of your heart. Smile and feel the Holy Spirit flowing within you as you breathe in and out.
